Type of activity:

Empowering children through physical activity

Short description:

Right to Play has grown to reach 2.35 million children. It aims to protect, educate and empower children to rise above adversity using the power of play in 15 countries, each with their own set of challenges for children. In these countries, the aim is to empower girls to resist early marriage and to continue their education, and to teach children how to protect themselves from diseases like HIV and malaria. It helps child laborers return to school and inspires refugee youth living in dire camp conditions to heal and succeed. Different types of play give children the opportunity to learn different things. Inside the classroom, games help children to actively engage in their lessons, enhancing their learning. Outside of the classroom, they play through performance, music or dance to gain critical life skills.
